

Animal Stories For Students Asian Elephants



Learning Objectives

After completing the program and participating in discussion, students will be able to:

- Explain the relationship between an elephant and a mahoot;
- Understand the importance of maintaining a healthy environment for wild elephants;
- Relate facts about the journey a mahoot takes with an elephant;
- Define nocturnal activity; and
- Explain the ceremony that takes place in India before a journey.

Review Questions

- 1. Ask students to explain what a mahoot is. What is his/her job? What is the main goal?
- 2. What is nocturnal activity? How does it relate to elephants?
- 3. What kind of ceremony is a puja? What does the mahoot ask for?
- 4. Ask students why it is important to study the relationship between elephants and humans. What can humans do to protect the elephant's natural habitat?
- 5. What is the name of the Indian deity with the elephant head? What does this god mean to the Indian people?
- 6. Are elephants good climbers? Is the answer to this question surprising? Why or why not?
- 7. Are elephants the largest creatures that live on land?
- 8. When is an elephant most defenseless?

Activities

- 1. Ask students to research Asian elephants. Using library sources, ask them to write a short report that discusses the Asian elephant's eating habits, survival skills, and family life. Finally, how might a wild elephant's life differ from that of an elephant that lives with humans?
- 2. Have a group discussion after viewing the program. Why is it important for the mahoot and the elephant to have a relationship that is built on trust? What does the mahoot do to build this trust? Do you think your pets at home trust you? Why or why not?
- 3. Ask students to research elephants from India and elephants from Africa. Ask each student to find information about each elephant's habitat, eating habits, and family life. Have students prepare a poster board that outlines similarities and differences between Asian and African elephants.
