CENTRAL ASIA: LIVING IN KYRGYZSTAN

BENCHMARK MEDIA, 1993 Grade Levels: 7-10 23 minutes

DESCRIPTION

Independent from the Soviet Union since 1991, this central Asian country lies on the old Silk Road between China and the Middle East. Looks at its religions, cultural influences, history, geography, industries, and nomadic people, the Kyrgyz.

 such as the religious and linguistic ties between Spain and parts of Latin America; ethnic

- 1. To depict how Central Asia's culture has been influenced by trade routes and the successive ruling empires.
- 2. To examine how the terrain, natural resources and climate have determined the way the Kyrgyz live.
- 3. To illustrate the economic conditions in post-Soviet Kyrgyzstan.

Discussion Items and Questions

- 1. What empires have forged Kyrgyzstan?
- Why does Kyrgyzstan retain elements of Russian culture?
- What are the two main religions in Kyrgyzstan?
- Why did some ethnic Russians flea when Kyrgyzstan first gained independence? How is this consistent with the Kyrgyz national identity?
- 5. What is the Manas Saga? Who are the manaschi?
- 6. Why was the Kyrgyz written language seldom used until recently?
- 7. How has the terrain of Central Asia shaped Kyrgyz traditional life?
 - a. Why is there not much farming in Kyrgyzstan?
 - b. Why are yurts central to the nomadic way of life? How are yurts and shyrdaks built?
- 8. How have the collective state farms of the Soviets changed in independent Kyrgyzstan?
- 9. What other changes have happened in the Kyrgyz economy in production and mining?
- 10. What are problems in the infrastructure, communication systems, and highways in Kyrgyzstan?
- 11. What are the similarities and differences in the Kyrgyz cities of Bishtek and Osh?
- 12. What three languages do Kyrgyz children learn? Why?

► Applications and Activities

- 1. Discuss how culture, climate, terrain, and natural resources effect how people live in your local area. Compare this to life in Kyrgyzstan.
- 2. Investigate the topography of Central Asia.

- a. Compare the collision that caused the Himalayan Mountains with the Tian Shan Mountains.
- b. Consider the benefits of the dams on the Naryn River to Kyrgyzstan.
- 3. Read Homer's *Iliad*, the Icelandic Saga, or Kyrgyzstan's *Manas Saga*. Discuss reasons ancient civilizations handed down through oral tradition their legends, myths, and epic poems.
- 4. Research the three predominant ethnic groups in Kyrgyzstan: the Kyrgyz, the Russians, and the Uzbeks. Depict a typical day; include religion, food, dress, language, and traditional livelihood.
- 5. Plan a trip to Kyrgyzstan. Consider tourist attractions, natural wonders, and cultural events.
- 6. Investigate the history of Kyrgyzstan. Consider periods of control by the Islamic khans, the Mongols of Genghis Khan, Czarist Russia, the Soviet Union, and independence in 1991.
 - a. Create a timeline showing the major events.
 - b. Evaluate the pros and cons for each era.
