The Hill of Fire Moko

Synopsis:

One morning, Moko was out when a storm approached. He thought he should take shelter under a large tree. An old man arrived and told him they needed to go back to the village, as during storms a tree always goes up in flames. Sure enough, a tree caught fire. Moko thought the man was surely a magician, to know what was going to happen.

Learning Objectives: Students will:

- Enjoy the origin story presented in this program.
- Understand how a thunderstorm forms.
- Evaluate Moko's reasoning and conclusions.

Vocabulary:

Lightning, thunderstorm, precipitation, weather, climate, cumulonimbus

Pre-Viewing Discussion:

Have you ever been in a bad thunderstorm? What was that like?

Why can storms be dangerous?

Post-Viewing Discussion:

How did Moko think the man knew what would happen? How did the man say he knew?

What causes a thunderstorm?

Further Activities:

Study recent storms that have impacted areas around you. Find out what causes these storms and what you can do to protect yourself in these situations.
