CAREER EXPLORATION AND PLANNING WHAT WILL I DO WITH MY LIFE?

Overview:

This video helps the viewer look at ways to explore career fields to learn more about the options for employment. It tells how to assess interests, skills and abilities, and suggests ways to use the *Occupational Outlook Handbook* and the *O*NET Guide* to match up with the right career. Then it shows how to begin planning for the career you want...what education or training is needed, any licensing or certification. Suggests job shadowing, internships, volunteering, and part-time jobs to learn more about a career field.

- ♦ Self-Assessment Assessing skills, abilities, interests, likes/dislikes; what you want/don't want to do; personality; assessment tools available.
- ♦ Career Exploration Ways and means: Resources to discover job and career options.
