LESSON GUIDE Great Cup Stack Challenge

Standard: Mental and Emotional Health
Topic: Communication
Indicator: Recognize and apply effective communication skills
Objective: Demonstrate effective speaking skills
Lesson Objective: Students will develop self-advocacy skills and demonstrate effective listening skills during a teamwork activity.

WHOLE GROUP ACTIVITY

Materials:

16 plastic cups 2 rubber bands 8 ribbons

Lesson Introduction / Review [5 minutes]:

- 1. Class will review effective communication skills
 - Listening skills
 - Self-advocacy
 - Leadership
 - Giving directions
 - Receiving directions
 - Asking clarifying questions

New Topic Instruction [5 minutes]:

- 2. Introduce the teamwork activity to the class and provide directions to the task.
- 3. Provide students with directions to the teamwork game.
- 4. Divide the class into two teams and provide each team with an opportunity to explore the materials.
- 5. Give each group two minutes to brainstorm and develop a plan of action for the task.

Student Connection (Guided Practice / Independent Practice) [30 minutes]:

- 6. Students will carry out the teamwork game
 - Each team will use only the supplies provided to carry cups from one side of the room to the other.
- 7. Teams will work without adult assistance for the first 5 minutes. If after 5 minutes the teams are unable to develop an effective strategy, adult suggestions will be given.
- 8. After the task has been successfully completed additional bonus tasks will be implemented:
 - Teams will stack the cups in a tower formation.
 - Teams will stack the cups in a pyramid formation.
 - Teams will return the cups to the original location without talking.

Lesson Conclusion [15 minutes]:

- 9. Students will rejoin together and review teamwork strategies.
- 10. Review the importance of teamwork and real life situations which require teamwork.
- 11. Conclusion activity: Students will share their "Highs and Lows" from the previous week.
